'Social business is not a charity'

Mysuru: People having intelligence, cognitive or social ability enjoy success in the field of business, said K Ramkumar, executive director, ICICI Bank.

He was speaking at special video talk on 'Intelligence, ability and social responsibility' organized by SDM Institute for Management Development (SDMIMD) in SDM College here on Monday. Replying to a student's query 'as to why intelligent people need not necessarily succeed in corporate world', he said: "In most of the companies, not only intelligent people succeed, but also those with intelligence, cognitive or social ability succeed."

The right blend of profit-making and addressing a social need is a key factor in running a social business. It is an effort to solve social problems and making society sustainable. Every social business is entitled to give two returns—financial return and social returns."
